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APS Reform funding provided for the development of mobile protective services software and the distribution of tablet PCs and digital cameras to all direct delivery staff in the In-home Program and the MH and MR Investigations Program. Caseworkers are now able to document case actions while they are working in the field, creating a mobile office environment. Also included in this sub-strategy is the purchase of video-conferencing equipment such as monitors, cameras, and connection hardware that enable APS caseworkers to consult with experts on critical cases. This telemedicine project will improve the quality of medical and capacity assessments for clients that are at risk of ongoing abuse, neglect and/or exploitation.

The statutory and/or constitutional provisions for this sub-strategy are found in the HR Code, Chapters 40 and 48.

## External/Internal Factors Impacting Sub-strategy:

The FY 2008-2009 ongoing cost of the tablet PCs associated with the mobile caseworker project is captured in Strategy 02.01.05 Agency-wide Automated Systems. There are no costs for telemedicine equipment beyond FY 2007.
