- July 2008Brief Council on LARBrief HHSC Executive Commissioner on LARComplete preparation of LAR documents
- August 2008Submit LAR in mid-August



Exceptional Item Development

Items are being organized into broad categories of the issues they address. These broad categories are:

- Maintain Current Services
- Retention and Recruitment
- Enhance Services



Maintain Current Services

- Maintain on an annual basis the phased-in initiatives funded for FY 08-09
- Replace non-recurring federal revenue so that current staffing levels can be maintained
- Address caseload growth in foster care, adoption subsidy, and relative caregiver programs
- Additional staff and purchased client services to address increasing caseloads



Retention and Recruitment

- Eliminate the use of Worker I as the entry level classification
- Establish pay incentives to recruit and retain certain staff
- Continue to improve worker and supervisor training
- Expand the use of educational stipend programs



Enhance Services

- Additional staff to lower caseloads and call center hold times
- Improve IT systems and security
- Increase prevention services
- Strengthen APS and Day Care Licensing oversight
- Enhance CPS service delivery and oversight



Detail for Enhance CPS Services

- Expand Family Group Decision Making
- Expand Kinship
- Expand Strengthening Families Initiative
- More Specialists Child Safety, Substance Abuse, Risk Managers
- More Preparation for Adult Living Resources
- Intensive Pilot for Substitute Care Workers
- Third Adoption Subsidy Ceiling
- More Program Support Staff
- More Attorneys for Due Process Hearings



Additional Items to be Developed Prior to Session

- Strengthen Capacity
- 5% outsourcing of case management

These items will be developed throughout the remainder of the calendar year with a target completion date of January 2009 to be presented to the 81st Legislature.
