YOU HAVE SPECIAL RIGHTS UNDER THE INDIAN CHILD WELFARE ACT, 25 U.S.C. § 1921 (a). These rights include the following:

1. The biological parents, Indian custodians, and the child's tribe have a right to intervene at any point in this proceeding.

2. The biological parents, Indian custodians, and the child's tribe have the right to petition the district court to transfer the proceedings to the appropriate tribal court. A petition to transfer may be submitted in writing or may be made orally to the court at the time of the hearing.

3. The hearing on this proceeding cannot be held less than ten days from the time this notice is provided to the parents and tribe.

4. The biological parents, Indian custodians, and the child's tribe have the right to request an additional twenty days to prepare for this hearing. The request may be made by written motion or by calling the court clerk at the number listed above.

5. The biological parents or Indian custodians may be entitled to court-appointed counsel, should they prove unable to afford a private attorney.

6. This notice must be provided to the biological parents, Indian custodians, and the child's tribe with a copy of the petition of this proceeding. The notice must be sent by registered mail, return receipt requested.

7. Take further notice that under the Federal Indian Child Welfare Act, 25 U.S.C.

§ 1915, there are placement preferences that must be followed in the absence of good cause to the contrary.

8. The tribe is further notified that this matter should be kept confidential.

THE PARENTS, INDIAN CUSTODIANS, AND TRIBE ARE ADVISED THAT THESE PROCEEDINGS MAY HAVE SIGNIFICANT CONSEQUENCES WITH RESPECT TO THEIR RIGHTS INVOLVING THIS CHILD, INCLUDING THE POSSIBILITY OF A LOSS OF CUSTODY OR THE TERMINATION OF PARENTAL RIGHTS.
