These advertisements can be found on various websites, including social media, job search engines, and even dating websites. Once the child responds to the ad, the traffickers use this as an opportunity to build a relationship and subsequently manipulate and/or coerce the child into compliance.

Safer Internet Day serves as a reminder to all of us to be vigilant, promote online safety and take action to protect our children from falling victim to these predators. By working together and implementing stricter measures, we can create a safer online environment for our children.
