Sub-strategy Description and Justification:

The Relative and Other Designated Caregiver Monetary Assistance Program established in SB 6 was modeled after the kinship care pilot operating in Region 11 (Corpus Christi, Edinburg, and the Valley). This sub-strategy reports the FY 2005 cost of the Region 11 pilot for the one-time integration payments of up to \$1,000 for each caregiver and the reimbursement of other expenses up to \$500 per year per child. This pilot ended with the implementation of the Relative and Other Designated Caregiver Monetary Assistance Program beginning in March 2006.

The statutory and/or constitutional provisions for this sub-strategy are the Texas Family Code, Title 5 and the HR Code, Chapters 40 and 42.

External/Internal Factors Impacting Sub-strategy:

Relative and other designated caregiver placements enable the child to live with people they know and trust, reinforce a child's sense of identify, and help ensure the continuation of lifelong family culture. It helps reduce the stress a child experiences when removed and helps overcome the "foster child" stigma. Providing relative and other designated caregivers with monetary assistance decreases the chances for families to become more deeply involved with the child welfare system and creates placement stability.

Federal and state statutes require placement preference to a relative able to meet the needs of the child in CPS conservatorship. SB 6 provided the ability to expand the pilot project statewide, based on its success that demonstrated fewer children returning to foster care and more relative and other designated caregivers receiving permanent placement of relative children.

This sub-strategy was funded with federal TANF funds. The State is required to provide a minimum of funding referred to as a "Maintenance of Effort" (MOE) in order to receive TANF federal block grant funding. Specific agencies are designated by the Legislature to provide the MOE for the State.
