Strategy Description and Justification: (1,600 Character Limit)
Under Executive Order RP 35, HHSC was directed to review and reform the CPS program. Detailed recommendations were developed and SB 6 was enacted by the 79th Legislature that outlined a comprehensive reform of DFPS to improve its services. An unprecedented increase in funding and FTEs was provided to achieve the improvements. CPS Reform funding contained in this sub-strategy provided additional resources for more Residential Child Care Licensing staff to address workload increases. This substrategy is associated with Strategy 1.4.1 Child Care Regulation.
