





Prevalence of Mental Illness and Substance Abuse in Children involved in Investigations or Alternative Response






Prevalence of Mental Illness and Substance Abuse in Children involved in Family-Based Safety Services






Prevalence of Mental Illness and Substance Abuse in Children involved in Conservatorship






Substance Abuse as a Factor in Removals






Prevalence of Mental Illness and Substance Abuse in Caregivers involved in Investigations or Alternative Response






Prevalence of Mental Illness and Substance Abuse in Caregivers involved in Family-Based Safety Services






Prevalence of Mental Illness and Substance Abuse in Caregivers involved in Conservatorship (Removals)





Of 52,180 unique children enrolled in STAR Health in FY 17, 53% had a mental illness or substance use disorder.

Risk factors such as substance abuse, mental health concerns, and domestic violence were common factors in confirmed child abuse and neglect fatalities:

- In FY 17, <u>52%</u> of fatalities caused by abuse or neglect involved a parent or caregiver actively using a substance and/or under the influence of one or more substances that affected their ability to care for the child.
- Almost <u>23%</u> of fatalities caused by abuse or neglect involved a parent or caregiver with reported or confirmed mental health concerns.
- Active domestic violence concerns were identified in <u>17%</u> of fatalities caused by abuse or neglect, but <u>40%</u> of these fatalities had a history of domestic violence.



- FBSS Pilot (SB 11)
 - Performance based contract to provide evidence based or promising practices case management services to reduce recidivism and removals of children.
 - Coordination with local OSAR, LMHA and local treatment providers, similar to CPS Legacy.
 - Working to establish telemedicine program to serve rural families
- Post-Adopt/Post-Permanency Support



- Community Based Care Expansion (SB 11)
- Therapeutic Foster Care Program
- Intense Plus Rate
- Temporary Emergency Placements Program
- Least Restrictive Placements (HB 1542)



Access to substance abuse treatment

- Availability/Location of services
- Waiting lists/Insurance coverage

Parent-Specific Challenges

- Employment challenges
- Child-care availability/frequency



- County-led initiatives like Bexar County and other specialty courts to sustain families through innovative treatment and judicial solutions
- Improved collaboration between agencies that serve similar populations
- Education of Judiciary and stakeholders on the challenges of substance abuse and use
- Enhanced services to support parent's sobriety when children are returned home
