## Sub-strategy Description and Justification:

In this sub-strategy, DFPS investigates reports of child abuse and/or neglect, provides protective services, and supports the placement of children in foster care if they are removed from their home. The 79th Legislature passed SB 6 that outlined a comprehensive reform of DFPS to improve its services, and provided an unprecedented increase in funding and FTEs. CPS Reform funding contained in Goal C provided additional resources to strengthen investigations and support quality casework by creating functional units, adding direct delivery staff to address high investigative and family based safety services caseloads, and providing a salary supplemental pay for investigative workers and supervisors.

This sub-strategy includes staff who investigate child abuse/neglect reports, provide casework to child victims in their own homes and in out-of-home care and their families, provide adoption services, and provide litigation services.

This sub-strategy is supported by the Information Management Protecting Adults and Children System (IMPACT) that is designed to provide complete casework management for reported cases of abuse, neglect, and exploitation in the state of Texas.

The statutory and/or constitutional provisions for this sub-strategy are the Texas Family Code, Title 5 and the HR Code, Chapters 40 and 42.

## External/Internal Factors Impacting Sub-strategy:

The FY08-09 request for this strategy does not continue all of the 100 new caseworkers provided for substitute care high caseloads because these new positions were funded for FY07 only. Additional funds are requested to restore 50 FTEs as part of Exceptional Item 2, Biennial Funding for Phased-in APS and CPS Reform Initiatives.

The request has also been reduced by 325 FTEs due to the loss of funds associated with method of financing changes. Exceptional Item 3, Restore Loss of Funds from Method of Financing Changes, requests the funds to restore the amount of Medicaid Targeted Case Management funds claimed from Sept. through Dec. 2005 that could not continue in the base request for FY08-09, and to fund the annualized impact of the shift in the direct delivery staff time study to non-entitlement activity.

Based on forecasted caseload increases for FY08-09, DFPS will need additional staff to maintain caseloads. Exceptional Item 4, Additional Direct Delivery Staff to Maintain Caseload per Worker, requests these additional staff. Exceptional Item 6, Additional Program Support Staff for Caseload Growth, includes a request to increase legal staff and regional screeners associated with the agency's request for the additional direct delivery staff.

The primary federal funds participating in this strategy are TANF, Title IV-E, Title IV-B, and Title XX. The State is required to provide a minimum funding level called "Maintenance of Effort" in order to receive TANF federal block grant funding. Titles IV-B and IV-E require a State match, and Title XX does not require a State match.
